I am so pleased to be here with you in Tisdale. We shall celebrate our first Christmas together. The connection I had with St. Paul's was good from the very beginning. The people on your selection committee were very gracious, and I sensed in the ambience of the exchange that this was "a Call". I am convinced that we will both benefit from our time together.

When I announced to others that I was going to Tisdale, many said, "It is a lovely town." It has proven to be so. It is a great place. The people I have met, including the other ministers in the community, have been very welcoming.

Christmas is coming. Recent weather has reminded us of that. Nonetheless, this is an opportunity to shine a light in the midst of increasing darkness. The greens and reds of Christmas will warm the heart. We already have the decorations up in the sanctuary, and they brighten our day.

We have a special children's program for the young people this year. Sisters Danielle and Bailey, daughters of Aaron and Erin Norris-Pott, have volunteered to help with crafts through the advent season. "Advent" simply means the coming of Christ (at Christmas). The children will be creating Christmas ornaments that point to the decorations of the season as well as to their symbolic meaning for the birth of Christ. This will all come to a head on Christmas Eve, when we light the Christ Candle and decorate a tree with our ornament symbols. We are inviting every member of the congregation to bring along a special ornament at the 7pm service on December 24th so you can put it on the tree as we sing Christmas carols. If you bring an ornament, you can retrieve it after the service.

So this is it. Our time together begins, and I look forward to meeting everyone in the days and months ahead.

Before I came to be with you, one of the people interviewing me for the call to ministry at your church contacted Deidre Kearns of Acclaim Health in Oakville Ontario. In January, Rev. Doug Hallman will begin a Sunday Sermon Series at St. Paul's United entitled "The Art of Listening". This will be coupled with the 2017 Lenten Series beginning March 5 - Communication and Spirituality in Situations of Tragedy and Loss". One follows naturally on the other.

The "Art of Listening" series will begin on January 15, 2017.

For 20 years, Rev. Hallman offered workshops on "listening and communication" to the Victorian Order of Nurses and Acclaim Health in the Halton Health Region of Ontario. The idea was to build awareness of non-listening responses and enrich the ability of volunteers, caregivers and health region staff to listen and hear others. For a number of years, Rev. Hallman was also invited to make presentations on "Advanced Listening Techniques" at Provincial Conferences for the Hospice Association of Ontario.

The St. Paul's series on Listening and Communication will be helpful to you at your work, in the volunteer associations and clubs in your community, as well as with friends, family and loved ones.

Finance Committee Report

St. Paul's congregation members owe a huge debt of gratitude to our Fall Supper Planning Committee who organized and carried out a very successful event once again, despite adverse weather conditions the day of the supper.

A sincere thank you to all members who contributed food items, monetary donations and voluntary labor to make this a very positive community event.

455 supper tickets were purchased and a net income of approximately \$5300.00 will be realized for the church when the final expense bills have been paid.

Our Financial Statement for Jan. 1, 2016 to Oct. 31st, 2016 shows total revenue of \$67,090.41 and total expenses of \$76,990.23 for a net deficit of \$9,899.82 for this period. However there are several major expense items which have not yet been included in this statement including our fall supper expenses, so our deficit by year end will be substantially larger than this.

With Thanksgiving and Halloween now behind us and Christmas and New Year rapidly approaching you are reminded that anytime now would be an excellent time to "top up" your annual church givings to assure that your total contributions are included in your year end tax deduction receipt.
